



Parent's Code of Conduct

1. I will ensure my child is properly and adequately attired for the training session/ events including: t-shirt, shorts and socks for dry land and trampoline
2. I will complete and return the Medical Information Form as requested by the organisation and provide details of any health conditions/concerns relevant to my child on the consent form. I will report any changes in the state of my child's health to the coach prior to training sessions or events. I will ensure that the organisation has up-to-date contact details for me and for any alternative person(s) as required.
3. I will pay club fees promptly, including competition fees.
4. I will encourage my child to obey the rules and teach them that they can only do their best.
5. I will behave responsibly as a spectator during training/events and treat members, coaches, committee members and other parents of members of both my child's organisation and any other organisation with due respect, in accordance with Swim England's commitment to equality and diversity.
6. I will not use inappropriate language within the organisation environment.
7. I will show appreciation and support my child and all the team members
8. I will not enter poolside unless requested to do so or in an emergency.
9. If I wish to have a discussion with the coach, I will check with the welfare officer as to how this can be arranged.
10. I will not coach my child from the spectators' area or interfere with the session in any way.
11. I will remain in the building at all times whilst my child is in the pool if they are under the age of 11.

SCDT will:

1. Inform you at once if your child becomes ill and will ensure their wellbeing until you are able to collect him/her.
2. Ensure good child safeguarding guidelines are followed at all times to keep your child safe.
3. Ensure all activities are properly supervised/taught/coached and that consent is obtained for any activity outside of that previously agreed.

You have a right to:

1. Make a complaint to the organisation if you feel the organisation or a member of the organisation is not acting appropriately or in accordance with SCDT rules and regulations. Details of how to do this can be obtained from the welfare officer.
2. Make a complaint on behalf of your child to SCDT via the Welfare Officer
